

Do-It-Yourself Seasonal Home Inspections

Doors and windows-

Gutters and flashing-

Are all gutters connected to downspouts?

Are downspouts draining away from the home?

Are gutters free of debris?

Does flashing show signs of rust or mold?

Making sure that gutters are functioning properly can help protect your home from water damage.

Roof-

Have there been any hailstorms in your area recently?

Do shingles show signs of curling on the edges?

When you look in your attic, do you see any signs of water damage? Are all vents functioning properly?

Small roof repairs are relatively inexpensive. Roofs damaged by hail are covered by insurance and should be replaced within a month of the storm.

Siding-

Are there any cracks in the home's siding?

Are there signs of mold or excess dirt?

Powerwashing your siding can freshen the look of your home, but be sure all cracks are repaired before you begin washing.
